SEPHARDIM JEWS

Sephardim Jews, also known as Sephardic Jews or simply Sephardim, are Jews who settled in the Iberian Peninsula around the year 1000. Their residence in Iberia was brought to an end starting with the Alhambra Decree by Spain's Catholic Monarchs in the late 15th century, which resulted in a combination of internal and external migrations, mass conversions and executions. Eastern Sephardim comprise the descendants of the expellees from Spain who left as Jews in 1492 or prior. This sub-group of Sephardim settled mostly in various parts of the Ottoman Empire, which included areas in near east (west Asia's middle east such as Anatolia, the Levant, etc.), the Balkans in southeastern Europe, plus Egypt. They settled particularly in European cities ruled by the Ottoman Empire including Salonica in what is today Greece, Constantinople which today is known as Istanbul on the European portion of modern Turkey, and Sarajevo in what is today Bosnia and Herzegovina. North African Sephardim, descending also from the expellees in 1492, settled mostly in Morocco and Algeria.

IGOR POMYKALO

Born 1946 in Rijeka, Croatia, in a family of musicians.

School and studies in violin and viola in Zagreb, diplom on the Music Academy in 1970.

Member of the Zagreb Symphony orchestra RTV /HRT 1966-1983.

Leader of the early music Ensemble Universitas Studiorum Zagrabiensis, 1969-1983. 1983-2000 living and working in Vienna, Austria (performing with Clemencic Consort, own Ensemble Lyra Wien and Tanz Atelier Wien - working at Musikhaus Doblinger). 1996-2001 scientific project "Lira da braccio and Lirone" at the University of Music Vienna.

2000 – 2004 living in Cittadella, Italy. 2004 up to now living in Piregg in Austria.

Numerous concerts and 20 CD recordings.

Cooperation with ensembles for early Music as Micrologus and Daedalus.

Various solo projects with early, contemporary and so called "world" music.

From 2007 on intensively working in his own recording studio at Piregg.

WHY I DECIDED TO MAKE A SEPHARDI CD

Around the mid of the seventies I heard about Sephardic Jews and their music and about the fact that they still existed as a small ethno-cultural and religious minority in Saraievo.

My dream and desire to perform their music and to "enter" as a musician into the world of Spanish Jews came true in 1991 thanks to a concert with the viennese ensemble for early music Accentus.

After that I had an intense and remarkable collaboration with "Ruth Yaakov Ensemble" in 1994, with the Lena Rothstein Ensemble in 1999 and with my own ensemble "AGIL" in 2000.

Even if the idea of making a CD exclusively with the choice of Sephardic songs was always present in my mind, I came to it only in 2006, when I started recording the whole material on my 8-track digital recorder BOSS BR 864. I played turbofiddle (a kind of violin/viola with 6 strings, five on the fingerboard and the sixth along it), electric violin, medieval fiddle, rebec and Koboz, a small Rumanian traditional folk lute. I programmed the complete percussions and drums on the same device.

Choosing the pieces, I decided to devote almost half songs to the Sephardim from Sarajevo, capital of Bosnia. After the horrible wars in this country, very few of them remained in Sarajevo as most of them decided to go to Israel.

Only recently, at the begining of this year, I decided that my seventieth birthday would be the right opportunity to complete this long and for me very important project. I decided to present the repertory on two CDs and in two versions which reflect my two worlds; ancient and modern music, early music and rock music.
